⁶ Students must take a course from the approved Scientific Reasoning (SR) Non-Lab General Education course list and should discuss options with their adviser.

⁷ 18 hrs. Including **SIX HOURS** from the Americas (US, African American, Native American, Latin American) and **THREE HOURS** from **EACH** of the following areas: Europe, Asia, and Africa. Must be at the 300-400 level or above, not including required history courses.

⁸ 12hrs. Students may take any Criminal Justice, Geography, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, or Anthropology courses for which they meet the prerequisites.

⁹13hrs. Students may take any course at the University for which they meet the prerequisites.
