**Minutes:**

- Dean Graves open the meeting after a quorum was met. He introduced the proposed Interdisciplinary Concentration in Race Class & Culture. Karen Hornsby presented the rationale for placing this program in University Studies.
  - UNST would approve the courses
  - CAS curriculum committee would approve the concentration
- Question was raised if the Faculty Roundtable can approve courses without knowing administratively where the concentration will be housed?
- Discussion turned to the question of prerequisites for three (3) of the proposed courses. A decision was made to add the language that “junior standing” is recommended in the course description. The other suggestion is to use explicit language that freshman and sophomores are not encouraged to take these courses.
- The Faculty Roundtable agreed to review the proposed courses and revisit the requested at the next meeting.
- Dr. Hornsby and Levey agreed to revise the course description for the three (3) courses in question and resubmit to Dean Graves.
