What is a Poet Laureate?

A poet laureate could be thought of as an ambassador of poetry, raising the consciousness of the community to poetry and its value both written and spoken. During the tenure, the Aggie Poet Laureate will write poems for special occasions such as graduation, give public readings, and initiate projects to help promote poetry awareness and literacy. The poet laureate will serve a term of one year.

The United States has a poet laureate, as do many states.

The candidates will undergo a rigorous vetting process as determined by the Aggie Poet Laurate Selection Committee. The committee will be comprised of professional writers and library staff.

Criteria:

- AAny A&T student in good academic standing is eligible to apply and serve, regardless of major.
- Candidate must have at minimum a 3.0 GPA.
- All submissions, which include an application and writing sample, will be submitted in electronic format using Microsoft Word in .docx or .rtf format (only), do not add any security settings.
- All samples must be typed using, no more than a 12 point font, and Times New Roman.
- All submissions must be received by the submission deadline (March 15,) to be considered.
