Students in the College of Business and Economics must earn a minimum grade of "C" in the following courses: ENGL 100, ENGL 101, MATH 111, MATH 112, BUED 110, ACCT 221, ACCT 222, BUED 260, ECON 200, ECON 201, ECON 206, FIN 343 (formerly FIN 253), MGMT 110, MGMT 132, MGMT 201, MGMT 303, MGMT 315, MGMT 495, and MKTG 230.

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¹Two MATHs are required for this discipline: MATH 111 and MATH 112. (MATH 103 & MATH 104 combined can substitute for MATH 111.) MATH 131 and/or MATH 132 can be used as substitutions for either MATH 111 or MATH 112. All MATHs require a minimum of grade C or better. MATH 110 is not a substitute for MATH 111.

²Recommended Scientific Reasoning I List: BIOL 100, CHEM 104/114

Recommended Scientific Reasoning II List (3 credit hour): ENVS 201, PHYS 101, PHYS 104, EES 234

³ Students planning to sit for the CFP exam should select FCS 316, FCS 406 or FCS 407.

⁴ Technical Area Electives **must** be chosen from the following courses: FCS 316, FCS 406, FCS 407, ECON 311, ECON 408, ACCT 326 and MGMT 427. Students planning to sit for the CFP exam should select from FCS 316, FCS 406 and FCS 407. Students planning to sit for the CFA exam should select from ECON 311, ECON 408 and MGMT 427.
