

STATISTICS THAT INDICATE THE PREVALENCE OF RAPE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT ON COLLEGE CAMPUSES

- 20–25% of college women are raped during their college career.
- 65% of these attacks go unreported.
- In 80–90% of cases, the victim and assailant know each other.
- Although women are more likely to be sexually assaulted, 10% of sexual assaults and rapes happen to men.
- The majority of sexual assaults/rapes are planned.




WHO IS A BYSTANDER?

A bystander is a person who is in the scene witnessing the situation either directly or indirectly.

TIPS FOR INTERVENING

- Approach everyone as a friend.
- Do not be antagonistic.
- Avoid using violence.
- Be honest and direct whenever possible.
- Recruit help if necessary.
- Keep yourself safe.
- If things get out of hand or become too serious, contact the police.





TIPS FOR BEING AN ACTIVE BYSTANDER

- Step in and separate the two people. Be a friend and let them know your concerns and reasons for intervening. Make sure each person makes it home safely.
- Use a distraction to redirect the focus somewhere else.
- Evaluate the situation and people to determine the best approach. You could directly intervene or ask others to come in and help.
- Say something to your friend if he/she is being too aggressive to you or others.
