Student Crisis Behavior Intervention Team (SCBIT) Response Protocol

Receipt of Critical Incident Report By the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and the Office of the Dean of Students

• Critical Incident Report defined as *incidents which are fraught with danger or risk, perilous;* forming or of the nature of a crisis, critical; and may include but not limited to: harm to others, diminished ability to care for self, and/or significant disruption to the learning or working environment.

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Student may be placed on Interim suspension which includes a preliminary hearing date

- **Student** is hospitalized by the University Counseling Center who enacts involuntary/voluntary mental health commitment or
- **Student** is placed in jail by UPD



SCBIT assembled

• Coordinate and assess additional information from faculty, administrators, students and local authorities.



Notification of parents, guardians, and/ or next of kin within FERPA guidelines



Campus disciplinary hearing

- If found responsible, student is issued sanctions or compliance requirements and remains a member of the campus community.
- If found responsible, student is issued sanction(s) which could range up to expulsion; re-entry conditions listed if suspended.
