EXCHANGE STUDENT FINANCIAL GUARANTEE

Financial Requirements: Federal regulations require that North Carolina A&T State University have documentary evidence on file that a non-immigrant student has adequate financial means to pay all tuition, required fees, insurance (health, repatriation and medical evacuation) and living expenses during the approved period of study at the University. Insurance is MANDATORY through the University and has now been set as a "required fee". Exceptions must be reviewed and approved by the Office of International Affairs prior to submitting a request to waive University insurance.

Exchange students must show adequate proof of funds outside those covered by the respective "Exchange Program Partner". Generally, all tuition and required fees are covered by the program, thus exchange students need to show the means to pay the living expenses while studying at NC A&T by providing supporting bank documents and/or a bank letter. The **original documents** should be provided to the U.S. Embassy/Consulate where the exchange student is taking the visa interview. *Copies can be provided to the OIA for issuance of DS-2019*.

Please note that the University of North Carolina System requires enrollment in the Mandatory Insurance plan which includes health, repatriation and evacuation. The limits of coverage meet and/or exceed the requirements set forth by the Department of State for Exchange Students. The cost of this coverage is approximately \$863.50 per semester.

New students will need a one-time "Settling-in" allowance of at least \$1200 (USD) if they are not living on campus. Apartments and other housing options in the United States generally require deposits and there are other costs associated with establishing utility services (electricity, water, gas, telephone, etc.) as well.
