We recently broke ground on the first phase of \$12.3 million worth of construction at the University Farm, signaling an expanded era of research, education, community engagement and agribusiness development.

- Department of Agribusiness, Applied Economics and Agriscience Education: Associate Professor Chastity Warren English and agribusiness management major DeShawn Blanding were named to the Inclusion and Diversity Task Force of the National Association of Agricultural Educators and the National FFA Organization.
- Department of Animal Sciences: Associate Professor Radiah Minor received the UNC System's 2018 Excellence in Teaching Award for N.C. A&T. This fall, the department welcomed the largest freshman class in its history.
- Department of Family and Consumer Sciences: Professor Shengmin Sang received a \$2.8 million grant to identify biomarkers for whole grain wheat and oats. Fashion merchandising major Desiree Hedrick, who graduated in May, was presented the 2018 Chancellor's Award for Academic Excellence.
- Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Design: Professor Guochen Yang and research technician Zhongge Lu earned a second patent for their work cloning the popular landscape evergreen Alexandrian laurel.
