The NC A&T State University Music Program has been fully accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) since 1991. We offer three degree programs for students wishing to pursue a career in music:

The Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education

Students pursuing this degree program must choose either a choral or instrumental concentration. The degree is tailored toward those wishing to teach music in the public schools (K - 12th grade).

The Bachelor of Arts degree in Music Performance

This degree is for those students wishing to pursue a career as a professional performing musician. Advanced musical knowledge and inherent musical talent are prerequisites for successfully pursuing this degree program. Many music performance majors plan to continue their musical studies in graduate school.

The Bachelor of Arts degree in General Music

For those students not wishing to pursue a career in music performance or education, we offer the General Music degree program, which allows the student to specialize in Electronic Music.

Our low student-teacher ratio ensures individual attention, and our faculty has studied with some of the world's finest musicians at leading colleges and universities. We emphasize career development and can place our graduates in competitive graduate schools or assist them in professional careers.

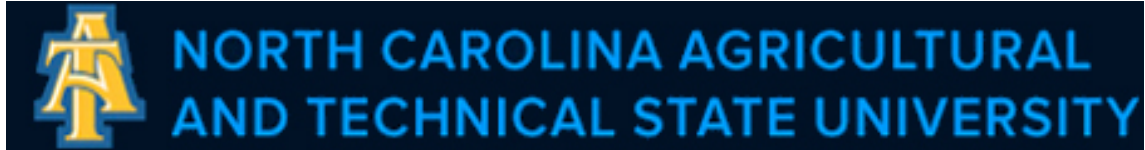

Bachelor of Arts in Music (General) - Electronic Music

N.C. A. &T. State University Electronic Music program combines traditional studies in music along with courses in music technology, composition, jazz and contemporary music styles, recording arts, and MIDI/synthesis. Students in this program gain hands-on experience in the music technology lab and recording studio. In this program, students can expose themselves to a variety of hardware and software that are useful for composition, engineering, and production.

The department's facilities include an electronic music studio equipped with G5 and Intel based Mac machines with an array of audio and MIDI hardware and software. Applications include Digital Performer, ProTools, Reason, and AudioMulch. The music technology lab is outfitted with MIDI keyboards, and music synthesis hardware and software. There is also a computer lab dedicated to composing and arranging with such music notation software as Finale and Sibelius.
