Dr. Alisha Taliaferro

Dr. Alisa Taliaferro has dedicated her professional career to education. She received an Ed.D. in Educational Leadership and an Ed.S. in Educational Leadership from Clark Atlanta University, a M.S. in Educational Administration and Supervision and B.S. in Elementary Education with a minor in Spanish from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University. Dr. Taliaferro also attended Harvard Graduate School of Education Principals' Center Institute.

Dr. Taliaferro has also distinguished herself as an outstanding educator, working in this profession as a teacher, public school administrator and university professor. Her competence, compassion and ethics as an educator are exemplary. During her professional career, her colleagues honored her with the Excellence in Teaching Award for Incorporating Innovative Instructional Practices in Classroom Instruction. In addition, the students in the Master of School Administration program awarded her a plaque as, "Outstanding Master of School Administration Program Coordinator." Her students often describe her as, "motivating, encouraging, enthusiastic and dynamic."

Dr. Taliaferro's research centers on culturally responsive leadership and social capital. She has created a unique model blending these two theories as a process for raising school achievement and creating better outcomes overall for students. Dr. Taliaferro is a published author in her area of research. Her article, "Building and Leveraging a Principal's Social Capital for Student Achievement" was recently accepted for publication. Her research proposal was also accepted for Hawaii University International Conference on Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences.

Dr. Taliaferro began her tenure at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University in 2013 as an associate professor and Master of School Administration program coordinator. She teaches courses in leadership theories and practices in the Department of Human Services and Development. She is a native of Greensboro, North Carolina. She is also a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority.
