**A minimum grade of “C” must be earned in all 10 (30 hours) courses listed above in addition to College of Business and Economics requirements. Students in the College of Business and Economics must earn a minimum grade of “C” in ENGL 100, 101; MATH 111, 112; ACCT 221, ACCT 222; BUED 260, ECON 206, FIN 253, MGMT 110, MGMT 201, MGMT 315, MGMT 495, and MKTG 230.**

Two MATHs are required for this discipline: MATH 111 and MATH 112. (MATH 103 & MATH 104 combined can substitute for MATH 111.) MATH 131 and/or MATH 132 can be used as substitutions for either course provided that two of these four courses are taken. **All MATHs require a minimum of grade C or better.** MATH 131 and MATH 132 are recommended for those planning to pursue graduate study. MATH 110 is **not** a substitute for MATH 111.
