A minimum grade of “C” must be earned in all 10 (30 hours) courses listed above in addition to School of Business and Economics requirements.

Two MATHs are required for this discipline: MATH 111 and MATH 112. (MATH 103 & MATH 104 combined can substitute for MATH 111.) MATH 131 and/or MATH 132 can be used as substitutions for either course provided that two of these four courses are taken. All MATHs require a minimum of grade C or better. MATH 131 and MATH 132 are recommended for those planning to pursue graduate study. MATH 110 is **not** a substitute for MATH 111.
