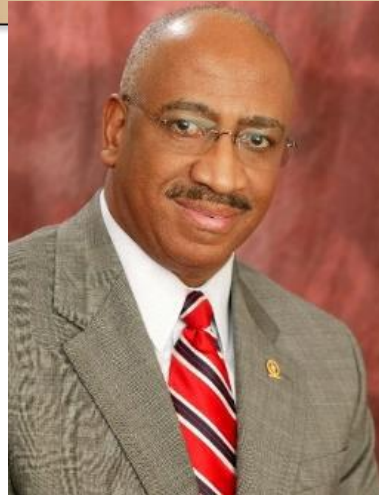


Executives in Residence

Mrs. Moore last served as Chief Executive Officer, Chief Operating Officer and General Manager of Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA), Philadelphia, PA. During her time at the head of SEPTA it was one of the top five transit agencies in the United States, with an employee population of 9,000, an operating budget of more than \$1 billion, a capital budget of \$500 million, and a pension plan with assets in excess of \$700 million. The service area was 2,200 miles, crossing into 2 adjoining states.



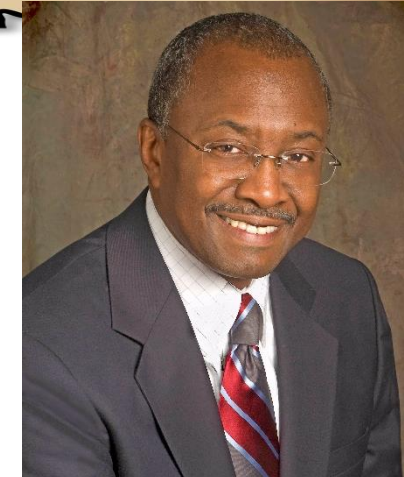
