The Master of Science in Information Technology (MSIT) degree program prepares students to pursue technical, as well as management careers in all employment sectors. The program emphasizes acquisition of sound theoretical concepts with intensive "hands-on" experience in the area of information technology. The courses are taught by faculty with high level expertise gained through their research activity, affiliations with industry and professional experience.

The MSIT offers two options: the thesis option and the coursework option. Each option requires a minimum of 30 semester hours. In addition, students must maintain and complete the MSIT program with an overall GPA of 3.0 or better on a scale of 4.0
